We have the blessing of welcoming **Thien Dang** as our guest preacher today. He ministers at the Campbell Church of Christ.

This morning, I had the honor of visiting and preaching for the Embomos Church of Christ. This church in the town of Embomos is in southwestern Kenya in Bomet County. They have just completed construction of a new church facility for 400 people. They funded and built it without outside aid.

The vibrancy of this congregation and the success of their building project point to the health of churches in this region. Churches are growing, and their financial capabilities are growing as the local economy progresses. Given the chance, Kenyans are proving to be capable in every possible way.

The vitality of Kenyan churches highlights a need for the Nairobi Great Commission School. Kenyan churches don't primarily need foreign donors to build church buildings, schools and orphanages—as attractive as those projects might be. They primarily need training & know-how. Preachers need equipping. Members need agricultural and business skills.

In other words, they don't need us to treat them like projects. They need to be treated as partners. I'm grateful for our long-term partnership with NGCS and for its growing footprint across the region. We have a lot to be grateful for!

Minister's Message

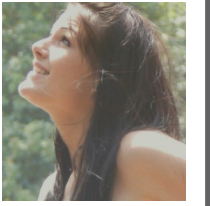
For three weeks IMPACT has been engaged in a new series called, "Who is God, Anyway?" The objective of this new series is twofold. The first is to spark the fire for God in the bones of our young believers. The second is to help them prepare for this day when the world is attacking what we know to be true more than any generation before them.

Sometimes we unintentionally become passive Christians, treating God more like a genie in the sky than the sovereign, intimate father He is. It is vital that we kindle the fire inside our souls for a more alive and present relationship with God.

As believers grow, they become more aware and confident in the truths of God. 1 Peter 3:15 says, "Always be prepared to give an answer to everyone who asks you to give the reason for the hope that you have." In order to have a relationship with God, we must care to know who He is. As this series unfolds, we will be answering tougher questions, questions that this generation needs to be ready to answer.
